#### 'SOME DAY WE GOTTA MAKE A CHANGE' NY'S DAIRY INDUSTRY AND THE MIGRANT WORKERS THAT MAKE IT POSSIBLE

Mike McMahon, former owner of EZ Acres dairy farm in Homer, educated the CBR club this week on the realities faced by the agriculture industry and the migrant workforce that makes it all run. In 1995, the McMahon's consolidated and modernized EZ Acres with new facilities that they thought would ease their labor issues. What they discovered is that little changed and they continued to struggle to find a source of reliable labor. In one year they had forty-two W-2s for what was supposed to be a thirteen-man crew, signalling a massive turnover rate. At the start of the new millennium they made the move to bring in Hispanic laborers, workers that were eager for consistent jobs that would allow them to stay in one place.

McMahon instantly fell in love with these workers, individuals from Mexico and Guatemala that would go on to not only stay and work at EZ Acres for multiple decades, but remain in and contribute to the Cortland County community. McMahon took it upon himself to pursue Green Cards for his workers, only to learn that all of their social security cards were forgeries. In this way, McMahon uncovered the bitter truth about how there are few legal paths for migrant workers in the agricultural industry, and none for year-round laborers. The H-2A program is available for seasonal labor for nine months of the year, and provides visas to around 310,000, whereas the need for laborers runs in the millions. The gap, especially in the dairy industry which runs 365 days a year, therefore, is generally filled via illegal means.

McMahon questioned how it can be possible to continue to support a growing economy without the legal labor to make it happen; to alleviate this issue he's testified in front of Congress, offering up a 17-point framework for legislation that would allow for longer-term guest workers. While it didn't seem to go anywhere at the time, McMahon remains hopeful that we're moving toward a positive change.


