CARRIE NARROW & CORTLAND REUSE



The Cortland Breakfast Rotary Club welcomed Carrie Narrow, Executive Director at Cortland ReUse, as guest speaker this week! Carrie started at ReUse five years ago as ReUse Coordinator, bringing to the job twenty years of non-profit experience.

The mission of Cortland ReUse includes working to extend the lifespan of our local landfill, which is estimated to have less than ten years left with no official plan for what to do next. Items are saved from the landfill and re-sold, or re-used in new and creative ways. The money made from sales goes to paying four employees a living wage, paying rent, or into vital programs that give back to the community. These include warming kits for the unhoused, as well as a partnership with Catholic Charities providing furniture and necessary home goods for those who have experienced tragic house loss.

The Annual Red Dragon ReUse event has been growing every year, and last year saved 80 tons from the landfill! Other campuses are starting to implement similar events based off of Cortland's example. Indeed, this year Cortland ReUse was awarded as Non-Profit Leader in NYS Reuse, Recycle, Reduction, so their impact is not going unnoticed!

Cortland ReUse gives back in so many other waysthey work with our very own Jackie Burke to collect medical equipment and crutches to be sent to Africa and Ukraine. Through ReStart Recovery Workforce, ReUse guides those recovering from substance abuse into a career. The space is also host to workshops including a writing workshop held every first Sunday.

Keep an eye out too for upcoming events in 2026 like the Fundraiser of Facts Trivia Night, and the Death at the Vault Murder Mystery Masquerade! Looking forward, as Cortland ReUse continues to grow, they are hoping to secure their own building.


