"SUSTAINING A VIBRANT FUTURE" DR. AMY KREMENEK & TC3

Dr. Amy Kremenek, President of the Tompkins Cortland Community College, was guest speaker this week! Dr. Kremenek provided the club with an update on TC3 and its goals for the future. With enrollment growing, a focus on strategic budgeting and rightsizing the college's footprint, efforts to become more flexible and nimble, as well as renewed emphasis on growing community connections, Dr. Kremenek is optimistic about the future of TC3 yet cautious as the environment in which the college operates continues to change.

As of Fall 2025, TC3's head count is up 9.4%, with full-time enrollment up 11%. Applications this year are also up 41%! This is encouraging, for as Dr. Kremenek expressed: "So goes enrollment, so goes the college." TC3 has also redesigned their enrollment process in an effort to move closer to a one-step model that minimizes the number of places a student has to visit, as well as reducing the amount of time to enroll.

There are over forty majors on offer at TC3, but Dr. Kremenek intends to reduce that number as the college looks to better align their academic portfolio to actually match the jobs that are available locally. The most popular majors currently include computer science, chemical dependency counseling, and computer information systems. The college is also expanding partnerships in transfer programs with other educational institutions, particularly in health sciences.

Other recent projects have included the development of a facilities maintenance master plan, and the college recently raised the funds to re-pave on campus. Additionally, TC3 has renovated four residence halls and is working on selling three others, while looking toward building a career center.

Finally, Dr. Kremenek emphasized that community colleges are "designed to meet the needs of the community in which they reside," and so by establishing partnerships with high schools, transfer institutions, and regional employers, Dr. Kremenek is ensuring the work of the college is in direct service and support of the community,




