It was a tough day to be a Zoomer; they could see and hear **Victor Rakovich** present to our Club, but they could not smell his wonderful products.

Press Gurwitz is the family name of Victor's partner in Amsterdam, Netherlands, and they have developed a unisex collection of fragrances. They manufacture and market body products, candles, shampoos, after shave, and deodorants. They develop the products in Europe, mix them in their shop in Virgil, and in Marathon they package and distribute the m.

Scent is a way to identify, and a drop of fragrance changes the experience of a lotion. Perfume is an extension of ourselves and our environment. Press Gurwitz has developed 15 fragrances, each with a distinct scent. They aim for boutique stores and department stores, using a niche perfume brand that does not conform to traditional formulation.

In its first year of operation, Victor and Press Gurwitz have learned a lot. For example, they were marketing the candle size that works in Europe, only to find out that Americans like bigger candles. They have a new distributor in the Middle East after they found that men prefer big bottles. Victor continues to learn the business worldwide, and exhibited his company at 25 shows in North America last year.

I hail from the land of Nomads - Kazakhstan, born in Soviet Union back in 1979. Witnessing my father's journey into entrepreneurship post the USSR's collapse, I admired his hustle, creativity, and knack for seizing opportunities to expand his business. His success in providing for our family filled me with pride. As I neared the end of my school years, I made up my mind to venture into owning and managing my own business.

Post high school, I was fortunate to secure a prestigious scholarship that brought me to the USA as an exchange student, attending an American High School. Graduating from Ulyanovsk State University, Russia, with a BS in Business Management, I kickstarted my career in the flooring industry in 2002. Since then, I've ventured into various businesses across New York and New Jersey. I began by pioneering a consumer-focused stretch ceiling company in NJ in 2008, which later evolved into Popcorn Ceiling Solution. Subsequently, in 2014, I launched a commercial/industrial brand named Awake Fabric Ceilings and Lighting. This venture involved developing acoustic solutions, fabric ceiling and lighting products, and installing high-resolution murals in diverse spaces like hotels, restaurants, museums, centers, universities, and churches.

Amidst the pandemic, I embarked on a new journey by delving into the perfume industry. Collaborating with a creative director and skilled perfumers, we crafted formulas and built a collection since 2019. Our line boasts a unisex collection of 15 distinctive fragrances, alongside perfumes, aroma diffusers, and a selection of bath & body products. Our aim is to create perfumes that seamlessly blend with one's personality and environment, becoming an integral part of their identity. This vision led us to curate not just a range of exquisite fragrances but also expand our offerings to include home scents, body care products, and hair care lines.

Glenn Reisweber affirmed that the newspaper article is accurate.




Valerie Kaiser not only delivers Girl Scout Cookies, she also delivers a Thank You card from her daughter Lila!



President-Elect Jackie Burke and her husband Mike picked up 40:sets of crutches for our Crutches for Africa program from Cortland Re-Use.


