BERNARD'S

There has been a Wineburg business on Main Street since 1940!

Steve detailed how his grandfather, with a partner, started Harold's Army and Navy Store on 103 Main St. His grandfather took over the Cortland store and passed away in 1953, leaving his wife with a business and two kids.

Steve's father, Bernie, worked at the store every day, and took over the business. In 1970 he moved the business to the corner of Main and Port Watson.

Steve followed his dad in the business, working at the store every day after school. After opening a store in Ithaca, they changed the name of the stores to Bernards.

While continuing as a men's store, Bernards transitioned to custom shirts and the logo business. As society changed to less formal men's wear, Bernards made the change to promotional products. They concentrate in embroidery and promotional products, and are leaders in the engraving market.

Steve is also a commercial building developer, and told us about the building on 107-111 Main St. that Bernard's was in. The Keator Block was built in 1835, and Steve showed us how it has changed over the years. In demolishing the building, Steve has not left a wall standing inside the structure. In rehabbing the Block, Steve relayed his frustrations in following the code for rebuilding, and repeatedly being bogged down by Federal and state historical preservation red tape. With the help of Congressman Marc Molinaro, Steve cut the tape and has proceeded with the project. When finished, the Keator Block will be a beautiful centerpiece on the busiest intersection in the county!



Hi, I'm Steve Wineburg a local business owner, property developer and family man who is a 4th generation resident of Cortland County. The Wineburg family has been a fixture in downtown Cortland since 1940 and has reinvented itself over the years in order to be successful and change with the times and serve our community. In addition to my business I have recently started to invest in larger buildings in Downtown Cortland.
