AMELIA BLOOMER WAS BORN DOWN THE STREET FROM THE CENTER FOR THE ARTS!

Along with Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Amelia Bloomer is one of the leaders of the right for women to vote—Women's' Suffrage. She attended the first Women's Rights Convention in Seneca Falls in 1848.

Amelia did not garner the recognition that Anthony and Stanton did, mainly because she moved to Ohio, then Iowa, a few years after the Women's Rights Convention. She was instrumental in bringing people like Anthony and Stanton together, and for spreading the tenets of suffrage, temperance, and abolition in her newspaper.
