

'PASSION FOR BOOKS & BUILDING COMMUNITY' ALL MY FRIENDS NEW & USED BOOKS



Haley Flannery and Edmund White have brought books back to Cortland's Main Street! All My Friends New & Used Books store opened in April this year, in the midst of the final stages of the Main Street construction project, and has already seen a booming business. In 2023, 291 new independent bookstores opened in the US, and Booktok, an online bookloving community found on platforms like TikTok and Instagram, has garnered over 370 billion views. Offline, readers are visiting book bars and attending silent reading events. In other words, we are in the midst of a reading renaissance but until this year Cortlandites lacked a local bookstore.

Haley, who was born and raised in the NYC area, spent summers with her family on Skaneateles Lake. She and her husband, Edmund, bought a home on the Lake and moved to Cortland County in 2021. In a post-pandemic world, book stores have made a comeback with readers seeking curated selections that require an eye for current trends and ability to adapt to local tastes. All My Friends introduces a cleverly curated selection of new and used books, bookish items, cards, and gifts to the book-hungry Cortland community. In addition, the store hosts local author events, and is seeking more ways to expand their offerings through book clubs and other collaborative opportunities. 

CBR 'Invades' the Noon Club






Sophie Clough was guest speaker at the Cortland Rotary Club this week!
