




**Sheila Ossit** is a SUNY-Cortland alumna, and is very involved with the community. The Cortland Memorial Foundation was founded in 1978, and is separate from the Hospital. It raises funds for the Hospital and the nursing center, and benefits the medical center. The Foundation affiliated with Guthrie in 2019, and has a huge commitment to the community.

Guthrie has accomplished a lot since 2019, having retained 84%of its employees, and signed on 72 doctors and nurses. It has joined the Mayo Network, which has expanded the Hospital in many ways: OB/GYN, pediatric care, and the Renzi Cancer Center. A lot of Sheila's time is in development resources and capital campaigns. They are involved with many fund raising activities; the golf tournament alone has raised \$1.3 million since its inception.

In 2023 the Foundation has several goals. It is adding a Behavioral Health Suite, which will provide private rooms for patients. It is installing a new parking lot on the Alvena Ave. side, and will be modernizing the elevators and improving the wifi in the Hospital. ## Cortland Memorial

Sheila Ossit is the Director of Cortland Memorial Foundation at Guthrie Cortland Medical Center. Prior to this role, Sheila was Director of Development for Foodnet Meals on Wheels of Tompkins County, where she was instrumental in securing grant funding for kitchen equipment, as well as for co-chairing Foodnet's annual Mac N Cheese Bowl—their signature fundraising event. Sheila was previously the Officer of Operations and External Relations for the School of Music at Ithaca College. Among her duties, she managed guest artist contracts, arranged for performance opportunities with local/regional partners, oversaw concert tours, facilitated alumni events, and provided promotional support for concerts. Before starting at IC in August of 2017, Sheila was the Executive Director for the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra (Ithaca's professional orchestra) for nearly 13 years. She was devoted to the success of the organization, and played lead roles in fundraising, development, expanding the reach and quality of the orchestra, facilitating educational outreach, and cultivating community relationships in the Ithaca and surrounding areas. She worked closely with internationally known music directors, Kimbo Ishii-Eto, Lanfranco Marcelletti, and many world-renowned artists and soloists. Under her leadership, the Family Concert Library Series and the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra's Youth Orchestra were created.

Sheila has been an active member of St. Anthony's Church in Cortland for over 28 years. She is currently a committee chair for the St. Anthony's Festival. Sheila is on the Board of Directors for the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra, Foodnet Meals on Wheels, and is a social member of Stella D'oro here in Cortland. She is also a member of the Cortland Lunchtime Rotary.

A proud breast cancer survivor, Sheila supports causes related to breast cancer awareness and research. A member of the Groton community for over 23 years, Sheila was co-chair of the Groton Recreation Committee for many years, and she ran several youth programs in Groton. She was also president of several Groton after-prom party committees, a youth sports coach, secretary for Groton Youth Football and Cheerleading, and she oversaw advertising and publicity for the Groton HS Musical programs.

Sheila and her husband, Kevin, moved back to Cortland in 2019, after raising their family in Groton. They have three adult kids (Zack-a history teacher, Nathan-an environmental scientist, and Maggie-an English teacher), two dogs, a "grand-cat" and a few "grand-turtles". Sheila enjoys gardening, cooking, wine tasting, and hosting huge gatherings for their friends and slightly enormous extended family.

Sheila graduated from SUNY Cortland with a BA in Communications/Media Relations, and has worked most of her career in fundraising, project management, community relations, and development.
