Clear Path, on Salt Springs Rd. In Chittenango, helps veterans with their transition to civilian life. Donovan explained to us that he is a peer mentor, a friend. You can walk a mile in my shoes, a mile in my boots.

Clear Path is one of the few organizations that take a holistic approach to help veterans reconnect with others. It does this by means of different programs and events. Some of the programs include: canine, peer and family, career services, culinary, wellness, and enrichment.


They hold a mobile canteen on Wednesdays, where all are invited to share a meal, laugh, and enjoy. The Friday Nite Fire is an opportunity for veterans to bond, and this month is geared to military connected kids.

Donovan explained that the Wellness Program helps veterans and families to take a break; it is easy to forget about the needs of military families. Clear Path has a way for them to reconnect.

The Canine Program is key in helping veterans, as while people let us down, dogs never do! To properly train a dog for this work takes over a year and between \$60,000 to \$80,000, and the work they do for a veteran is life supporting and affirming.

The Career Services doesn't just try to help veterans find a job, but one that is right for that veteran. They find not tinkly work but a renewed purpose. We thank Donovan not only for his service with the Air Force and the Marines, but for the wonderful work that he and Clear Path for Veterans is doing!
