Rotary District 7170 is proud to present world-renowned pianist and composer Emmanuel Sikora in a uniquely intimate performance setting. Experience beautiful music and bid on wonderful works of art from Emmanuel's brother Robert Sikora at this one-time fundraising event that is not to be missed!

Emmanuel Sikora, an American music composer and pianist who grew up in the Cortland, NY area, will be performing a fundraiser concert for Ukraine on November 19, 2022 at Phelps Mansion (191 Court Street) in Binghamton, NY at 4:00pm with doors opening at 3:30pm. Sponsored by Rotary District 7170, tickets for this event will be \$21.00 and offer an exclusive opportunity to hear one of our country's best young pianist / composers in an intimate environment. There will also be an auction of a limited number of original artworks donated by Emmanuel's brother Robert Sikora. Rotary is a worldwide service organization that has dedicated itself to "Service Above Self" for over 100 years, with over 1.4 million members in 200 countries or geographic regions of the world.

Sikora still lives in Cortland and is the son of Peruvian and American parents. He began studying the piano when he was 6 and started composing at 9 years of age. He graduated from Queens College in 2012 and was then invited to attend Samuel Adler's summer semester for young composers at the Free University of Berlin. He graduated from Binghamton University with a Masters in Music in 2014.

At 16, Sikora won a national prize for his art song "The Shadow Rose" and was invited to attend a performance of his work at the National Association for Music Education's National Conference in Milwaukee (Wisconsin). While in Milwaukee, he met Maurice Peress, who later became his conducting and composition teacher at Queens College.

During his studies and through his 20's, Sikora's career was largely a private one. In late 2020, he started a YouTube channel, and within a year, his videos had received over 300,000 views. Sikora then began playing the piano in public more regularly, with programs consisting of his own work, as well as pieces by colleagues and improvisations.

Sikora made his professional performance debut with the Ukrainian Festival Orchestra at the Lviv Organ Hall. Sikora continues to perform in recitals and with orchestras throughout the United States and Europe.
