

This multi-day event held at SUNY Oneonta featured a schedule of speakers including entrepreneurs encouraging the attendees to learn their strengths and weaknesses; a police officer discussing the consequences of alcohol and substance abuse; and Anna's personal favorite- Supreme Court Judge Cheryl who talked about her journey from going to college thinking she was going to be a doctor, to switching paths, making the "leap of faith to do what her heart wanted to do."

In between speaker sessions, Anna got to engage in a number of fun activities with her small group, which she described as becoming like a family to her. She also joined the cheer team interest group which involved presenting a special cheer before each presentation.

RYLAthon featured trivia, minute-to-win-it, and leapfrog games, and the winners received a shiny belt like that seen in WWE.

At the talent show, Anna's group presented a dance to Justin Bieber's "Baby."

Before heading into RYLA, Anna described feeling somewhat lost, not connecting with her peers who she felt didn't work as hard at their schoolwork as she did. But at RYLA she was able to create connections with those who she saw as the next leaders in her generation. The experience also provided a taste of college, helped her network, and taught her how to accept change, grow, and foster grit and perseverance in her life.
