Anthony Vicente Lime Hollow

THE WOODS PROVIDE EVERYTHING THE KIDS NEED

Is the mantra that Anthony Vicente provided us after reflecting on his ten years of being **E**ducational Director at Lime Hollow. Having kids of all ages at Lime Hollow is fun, and Anthony has implemented two new initiatives this year:

Forest Days

Is currently for Pre-K and 7th grade students at Homer High School. The kids get to explore, question, and learn. The novelty of the woods challenges them, as they go outside and play—they have their own agency with exploring, what Anthony refers to as "dirt time"—being exposed to new things. Anthony explained how NY State learning standards are fulfilled in subjects like Phys Ed, physics, chemistry, and other subjects. The program currently has students from the Homer Schools, and if transportation can be solved they will be joined with kids from other districts.

Outdoor After School Program

Is for Kindergarten through the 6th grade. The kids get off of the bus and are outside playing, touching things, and seeing things. This program is guided by the kids; some of their activities are gardening, learn skills, sledding, playing in the mud, backyard bird count, cooking plants from the garden, using spices they grow in their food, and making and drinking tea. Anthony relayed how he obtained an emu egg from his mother in law, and the fun (and delicious) experience the kids had h it. In winter time the kids learn how to observe what is going on in the woods in the dark, and games they can play like laser tag.

It is easy to bemoan the proclivity of children today to be attached to computer screens and phones; we are thankful for the fine work that Lime Hollow and Anthony do!



Anthony obtained his B.S. from SUNY ESF in Environmental Biology, aspiring to be a field scientist studying reptiles, amphibians, or native plant communities. However, his career took a turn when he participated in an Americorps internship as an environmental educator at Lime Hollow in 2013. This experience introduced him to the Art of Mentoring and the importance of connecting people with nature, leading him to shift his focus to Environmental Education. He furthered his career by working as an interpretive ranger in New Hampshire State Parks, as an Environmental Education Coordinator for Cornell Cooperative Extension in the Hudson Valley, and receiving his Masters Degree in Recreation and Leisure Studies at SUNY Cortland. Anthony's strong bond with Lime Hollow brought him back to Cortland, where he worked as a Forest Preschool Teacher where he assisted in obtaining full licensing for the forest preschool as a daycare. Currently, Anthony is the Education Director at Lime Hollow and oversees all of its school-aged programs, including field trips, after-school activities, summer camps, and weekend programs.
