Pino Alarco Hernandez Introducing Spain!

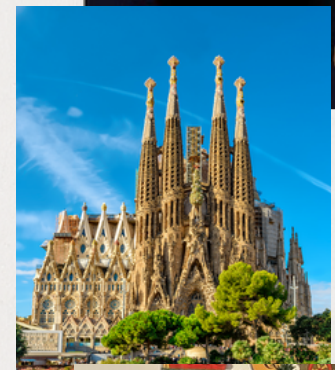
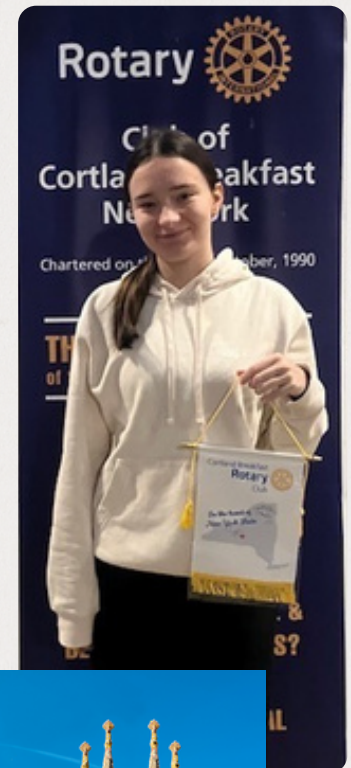
This week, Cortland Breakfast Rotary's current exchange student, Pino Alarco Hernandez, introduced her home country of Spain!

Located in the southwest of Europe, Spain is rich in culture and traditions. Throughout the year there are various fairs and festivals, some featuring residents in traditional clothing.

Pino described some of the popular foods such as paella, tapas, churros, and her favorite- Spanish omelette, which contains potatoes and onions.

Pino also explained some of the cultural differences between Spain and the U.S. In Spain, they eat lunch and dinner much later, with lunch taking place around 2 or 3 o'clock, often followed by a siesta or brief nap, and dinner falling as late as 9 or 10 o'clock.

The capital of Spain is Madrid, with other famous places including Barcelona in which the Sagrada Familia, a church undergoing continuous construction since 1882, is located. Pino thinks that the most beautiful place in Spain is Andalusia, which is located in the most southern part of the country. Spain features a variety of landscapes, with popular beaches and mountainous regions suitable for skiing.
