

The Bon Ton Roulet is a bike tour through the Finger Lakes; it is the largest fundraiser for both the Auburn and Cortland YMCAs. In showcasing the Finger Lakes, the BTR is enjoyed by people from all over the country. Participants ride from 45-65 miles a day, enjoy two rest stops a day, and spend the night at colleges or state parks. Roughly 350 cyclists participate each year, and a popular stopping point are the many wineries in the area.



Hannah explained to us the importance of volunteers to the Bon Ton Roulet. In this 7 day tour, volunteers register cyclists on July 22 at the Cortland County Fairgrounds, and support riders on the road.. A very important component is the SAG, the all purpose repair and refuel van. An idea would be for our Club to host a rest stop as a fundraiser.
